

## Book Club Game 1

### Break the ice

This is a simple but fun activity, guaranteed to get your Book Club members talking. If you have a lower level group, start with more general questions about their hobbies, films, books, cartoons, magazines. Try to make the members feel relaxed and help them understand that this activity is not a test.

**Number of students:** between 3-10 students

**Time:** 15-30 minutes

**Materials:** a box, a bag or a hat; scissors; sheets of paper

**Procedure:** Write down at least one question for each member. Cut the sheets up to paper strips and put them in a container. Ask each student to answer a question.

### Example questions:

- What is your favourite book of all time?
- What was the first book you read?
- What is your favourite children's book?
- What types of books do you like reading most?
- Which book left the deepest impression in you? It might not be your favourite book.
- Is there a book you have read more than once? What is it and why did you read it again?
- What books are on your bedside table at the moment?
- Is there an author or a book that you really don't like?
- Where do you usually read?
- Which character in a book do you think is most like you?
- Which character in a book would you most like to be?
- Which literary character scares you?
- What book do you plan to read next?
- What object do you always have when you are reading? A cup of tea? A blanket?
- Which is your favourite time of the day for reading?

You can print the next page with the example questions.
